Myke kvaliteter

iT fikk nettopp bevilget 460 millioner av regjeringa til bygging av nytt teknologibygg. Det er interessant å merke seg den umiddelbare responsen fra studenter ved det gamle bygget, et bygg som overhodet ikke kan matche det nye hva angår moderne fasiliteter.

- Det eksisterer en egen sjarm i å studere ved høgskolen, sier ingeniørstudent Morten Rune Hansen. Atmosfæren og nærheten man får til lærerne og studentene er

helt unik, sier han. Det nye teknologibygget blir stort, flott og fantastisk, men klarer det å ivareta den samme nærhetsfølelsen som studenter føler i dag i deres gamle bygg?

Nærhet er ikke et begrep som står øverst på lista hos regjeringas etter hvert berømte nordområdesatsning. Satsningen er et eksempel på hvordan politikere tenker seg verdiskapning i den økonomiske betydningen av ordet: Økonomisk vekst og videre utvikling.

Naturvitenskapelig satsning trengs da for å utvinne de "enorme økonomiske ressursene" som finnes i nord, ifølge regjeringas nordområdeutvalg. Hvis det handler om verdiskapning – som i klartekst betyr å lage mer penger – trenger vi å utvikle teknologisk ekspertise. Men det er ikke hva studenter sammen med lærere bryr seg om og lengter etter.

Jo, vi sier ja takk til pengefordelinger til UiT og til vårt område av landet. Men det ingeniørstudent Morten Rune Hansen kaller "nærhet til lærere og til studenter" er ikke målbart i kroner og øre. Det handler om menneskerelasjoner og en følelse av tilhørighet, to områder av studenttilværelsen som ofte ikke når medias forsider.

I siste års debatt om humaniora versus naturvitenskap har de teknologiske fagene seiret, i hvert fall når det gjelder pengebevilgninger. Av budsjettet til Norges forskningsråds fikk humaniora bare tre prosent av de mange forskningsmilliarder. Tekniske og naturvitenskapelige fag får over 60 prosent.

Når rektor Jarle Aarbakke videre ønsker seg nytt medisinog helsefakbygg til nye millioner – ja, til og med milliarder – er det helt avgjørende at såkalt verdiskapning handler i mye større grad om de "myke" kvalitetene.

Moderne bygg blir reist for å gi studenter en trygg, moderne og kvalitetssikret utdanning. Uten et like stort fokus på de mellommenneskelige verdier, kan rektor Jarle like gjerne slenge alle milliardene sine på havet. Det sier seg selv hvorfor.

Om universitetets Uvett er like mye tuftet på humor skal være usagt, men det er en akronym for universitetets- videre og etterutdanning. Med det menes det at Uvett er et kompetanse- og ressurssenter innen organisering og tilrettelegging av fleksible studier og etter- og videreutdanning.

Spør du derimot folk på gata i Tromsø, så er de vokst opp med humorboka, og budskapet som universitetet som et seriøst og ordentlig organ blir nok ikke forstått på samme måte. Kanskje er det en av grunnene til at det er så få tromsøværinger som tar etter- og videreutdanning? På campus er de i hvert fall ikke. Derimot er det et tilbud som mange i distriktene tar for seg.

Logopedimasteren er et eksempel på et av studieprogrammene som er kommet i gang som et samarbeid mellom Uvett og et av universitetets fakulteter – i dette tilfellet HSL. Disse 15 studieplassene vil aldri komme lengre nord enn Nesna, så kan man jo spørre seg selv hvor uvettig det er. Spesielt siden Universitetet i Nordland også har opprettet 20 studieplasser innen samme emne!

Nesna er et av Uvetts noder (eg. knutepunkt). Nordland, Troms, Finnmark og Svalbard er områdene som er med i universitetets nodesystem, og innebærer at universitetet har ansvar for en forsvarlig etter- og videreutdanning i hele Nord-Norge. Enn så lenge har ikke Universitetet i Nordland et eget utviklet organ som tilsvarer Uvett, men hva vil skje når de krever å få drive denne utdanningen i sitt eget

Uvett skal arbeide for at UiT blir blant de nasjonalt kvalitetsmessig ledende på fleksibel utdanning, men skal de greie det må de ha noe å tilby sine studenter. Én ting er det å skred dersy et opplegg for Hæren, eller en annen privat aktør. Noe helt annet er det å tilby et opplegg som kan favne den generelle student. Kan emnene som tilbys på campus i dag mer eller mindre direkte overføres til de fleksible studiene?

Vi har opplegg i dag som gjør nettopp det. Eksempelvis har et enkeltemne innen dokumentvitenskap 10 studenter på campus, mens det har 35 studenter i Nordland! Er det Uvett som har gjort en særdeles godmarkedsføringsjobb, eller er det noe feil med studieprogrammet på campus? Hva har vi å tilby disse studentene etter dette emnet?

I dag har vi bare ett bachelorprogram innen økonomi og administrasjon, som tilbys som et fleksibelt program. Vi har riktignok 2 masterprogram, men siden begge er erfaringsbasert er de rettet mot andre målgrupper enn dagens studenter.

I rettferdighetens navn er det kanskje ikke Uvetts mandat å gi et fullverdig studietilbud til de som allerede er aktive studenter ved campus. Likevel er det kanskje flere enkeltstudenter som kunne hatt en ubetinget fordel av å følge et emne som fleksibelt studie, selv om det gis forelesinger på campus. Årsaken er at siden de fleksible studiene stort sett er internettbasert, får man alle forelesingene på enten video eller podcast. Dette medfører at du kan



Killing me softly

11.09.2001-11.09.2011

September, 11

At 09:03 a.m. a United Airlines Flight 175 crashes into the South Tower of the World Trade Center, New York City,

In an apartment a woman holds the telephone tightly, desperately trying to reach her husband. He is alive, she is sure, for he called her just a couple of minutes ago from the South Tower saying that he is ok and the building is safe. He called from the impact zone.

A woman holds the telephone and does not know yet that some time later her husband will be able to get in touch with her again, but this time to say only that he is near the roof, and there is no way out.

Later, she would tell him they should better say "goodbye" to each other.

They would stay together on phone till the very end. At 09:59 a.m. the South Tower will collapse.

She does not know yet, but all they have is 56 minutes...

One week later

One week later, I look at the face I know and like so much. His eyes are smiling, bringing back memories about many laughs we shared, his gentle humor and quick mind. My God, he is so full of life! So bright, kind, funny and so serious abo-

I look at his face; he smiles just as he used to.

Do you have any idea, how much I like you?! – I mutter to him. – And how much I wish I said it to you just a little ear-

I look at him, at his photo on the wall under headline "missing", and for a split second it seems that my heart is about to burst...

Aftermath

In the September 11th attack, 2,606 people were killed in New York City, both at the WTC and on the ground. In the South Tower only four out of approximately 600 people who were above the impact zone (between the 77th and 85th floors) at the time of the plane crash were able to escape from the building. In the North Tower none of the 1,366 people who were at or above the impact zone (93rd - 99th floors)-survi-

¶idligere denne måneden offentliggjorde Forsknings- og ▲ høyere utdanningsminister, Tora Aasland at Universitetet i Tromsø får igangsette byggingen av et nytt teknologibygg med beliggenhet i Breivika. Dermed kan studenter og ansatte med studiested i Strandvegen belage seg på nye og moderne lokaler fra våren 2014.

Samler teknologifagene

Det nye bygget som er planlagt til 8200 m2, skal huse institutt for ingeniørvitenskap og sikkerhet, institutt for fysikk og teknologi og Tromsø geofysiske observatorium. Det vil i

alt være plass til 600 studenter. Seksjonsleder og universitetslektor, Inger Johanne Lurås har ventet lenge på et nytt bygg.

en fantastisk nyhet for oss. Det vil bli en stor forbedring, ikke bare faglig, men også med tanke på studiemiljø. Ved å forene institutt for teknologi og institutt for ingeniørvitenskap og sikkerhet, vil vi få en enda større effekt av fu-

sjonen. Fra å være et fakultet som er spredt på tre ulike steder i Tromsø, vil vi da være samlet i Breivika, sier Institutt for ingeniørvitenskap og sikkerhet holder i dag til i lokalene til gamle høgskolen i Strandvegen, som frem til begynnelsen av 1990

tallet fungerte som sentralsykehuset i Tromsø. Etter at høgskolen overtok lokalene er det lite som tyder på at oppussing og vedlikehold er blitt prioritert, og bygget fremstår nå som gammelt og slitt.

- Lokalene i Strandvegen har aldri vært ment å skulle være permanente. I tillegg er leieavtalen i ferd med å gå ut, forteller Lurås.

Det tekniske utstyret er en god blanding av gammelt og nytt. Flere av studentene vi har snakket med forteller at noe av utstyret er over ti år gammelt, og behovet for en oppgradering er dermed stor.

- Når det kommer til nytt utstyr tror jeg Flere studenter med studiested i Strand- ikke vi blir like høyt prioritert som før. Ryktene om innkjøpsstopp har gått i lang tid allerede, så nytt og moderne utstyr må nok vente til åpningen av nytt bygg. Men om jeg skulle måtte velge mellom campus og lokalene vi har nå, ville jeg uten tvil valgt å bli her i Strandveien. Vi stortrives her, avslutter Hansen.

> Det er bevilget 403 millioner til prosjektet, i tillegg til nytt utstyr til ca. 60 millioner. Målet er å ta i mot nye studenter allerede fra høsten 2014.

Har ikke gitt opp kampen for MH 2

Det var lutter glede fra rektor Jarle Aarbakkes side da Tora Åsland offentliggjorde at UiT skal ha et ferdig teknologibygg i 2014. Likevel var det ikke med et udelt hjerte Aarbakke tok imot nyheten.



INTERVJU AV STEWART HÅSETH

- Vi er selvsagt utrolig takknemlige for at UiT et sårt etterlengtet teknologibygg. Ingeniørene har vært i Strandvegen siden begynnelsen av 70-tallet, og allerede da var det et midlertidig bygg for oss. Det er også usikkert hvor lenge vi får være i disse lokalene derfor hastet det å få et endelig studiested for våre studenter, sier Aarbakke.
- Likevel hadde vi satt MH2 som et viktigere strategisk bygg. Ikke misforstå meg, vi trenger begge byggene, men på dagens MH bygg er vi overfylt. Over 1000 studenter her har ikke tilfredsstillende læremiljøer, og det er studentgrupper som ikke har noe eget sted å gjøre av seg mellom forelesingene. Dette er ting vi i administrasjonen er klar over, men med dagens situasjon er det vanskelig å forbedre dette er jeg redd.
- MH2 koster dobbelt så mye som teknologibygget, og det kan kanskje være en av årsakene til at Åsland valgte å prioritere som hun gjorde – men det er bare spekulasjoner. For vår del vil vi nå kjempe for at MH2 kommer på neste års budsjett. Vi har også et lærerskolemiljø som står i kø for et bygg i Breivika. Fordelen her er at disse to byggene står i to ulike køer, og vi kan derfor satse på begge byggene, uten at det ene står i veien for det andre. I tillegg har vi magasinet til Tromsø Museum, hvor vi har 1500 gjenstander som i dag ruster bort. Dette bygget står i en tredje kø, så om vi får alle disse byggene igjennom kan det bli en hektisk byggeperiode ved UiT.
- Det nye teknologibygget vil også ligge så nært grunnforskningsmiljøene og Forskningsparken, at det vil øke attraktiviteten for universitetet. Ikke minst er det bra at vi på denne måten kan sammenbinde fysikkfagene og ingeniørutdanningen på en best mulig måte, avslutter Aarbakke

va får du for 30 kr? En is på kiosken, en brus eller to-tre pakker havregryn på dagligvarebutikken. Hva om du fikk forespørsel om å droppe den isen eller spise litt mindre havregryn en uke, og heller gitt de pengene til et godt formål, ville du gjort det da?

For hvert semester betaler vi en semesteravgift på 420 kr. Av disse kronene er 20 kr frivillig og du kan velge å betale 400 kr i stedet. Betaler du likevel 420 kr går 20 av dem kr til SAIH (Studentenes og akademikernes internasjonale hjelpefond). Det er nå foreslått at denne støtten skal økes til 30 kr.

Hva er SAIH?

Ved en mulig markant prisstigning er det viktig å vite hvor pengene dine går til. SAIH jobber hovedsakelig med bistand til utdanning og informasjon om saker de er opptatt av. I dag støtter SAIH utdanningsprosjekter i Zimbabwe, Sør-Afrika, Zambia, Bolivia og Nicaragua. I følge Janvier Mbongo Nzigo, leder for SAIH i Tromsø, er tanken at du som student kan vise solidaritet og støtte studenter andre steder i verden.

På lokalt nivå drives det med mye informasjons- og påvirkningsvirksomhet. En sak som er oppe nå er okkupasjonen av Vest-Sahara, som Janvier vet at mange ikke har hørt om. I denne saken ønsker de å presse UD til å få ut norske selskaper fra Vest-Sahara.

Men hva om støtten øker til 30 kr?

Janvier tror ikke dette vil være noe problem, det vil neppe føre til at færre velger å reservere seg mot å betale. De fleste støtter SAIH fra før av og han tror de vil fortsette med dette. Med tanke på at vi har det så bra i Norge, synes han det hadde vært positivt om studentene i Tromsø betaler 10 kr ekstra. 30 kr i semesteret vil neppe merkes, selv ikke med en skral studentøkonomi.

Erik Schreiner Evans, nestleder i SAIH's styre, sier at de alltid vil ha behov for mer støtte. Nå får SAIH ca 160 000 kr i semesteret fra UiT og totalt får de 6 millioner fra andre universiteter og høyskoler i Norge. Pengene de mottar går i det generelle budsjettet og ikke til bestemte prosjekter. Mer penger fra UiT vil gjøre de i stand til å fortsette med og forbedre pågående prosjekter og starte opp nye. De er i midlertidig ikke bare universiteter og høyskoler de mottar penger fra største delen får de av andre organisasioner.

Det hjelper!

Erik minner om at studentbevegelser har vært og fortsatt er en bra drivkraft for demokratiet og menneskerettigheter. Slikt engasjement har tradisjonelt hatt en sterk politisk effekt og SAIH støtter flere slike prosjekter.

Når kan du legge av 30 kr til SAIH?

Forslaget må først gjennom en behandling i studentparlamentet, det er de som avgjør det. Foreløpig har de ikke fått inn søknaden, men de regner med å få den når alt er klart. Så foreløpig får vi vente i spenning.

Fem norske forskere får Det europeiske forskningsrådet (ERC)s prestisjetunge stipend Starting Grants, blant dem er kjemiprofessor Kenneth Ruud ved NT-fakultet.

enneth Ruud regnes som en spesielt lovende forsker, noe hans enorme produksjon bevitner. Han produserer forskerartikler tilsvarende halvannen doktoravhandling per år, og er i tillegg til dette leder for Centre for Theoretical and Computational Chemistry (CETT). Ruud ble professor allerede som

32 åring, men dessverre tar forskergjerningen så mye tid at det ikke er lengre tid til undervisning. Utropia treffer Ruud direkte fra en studietur til Japan, så det er tydelig at dette er en professor flere har fått øynene opp for.

- Personlig savner jeg kontakten en

får med studentene i forelesingene, men siden jeg ble frikjøpt i første omgang til å jobbe med CETT har jeg nå ingen ledig tid til å holde rene forelesinger, sier Ruud. Med dette nye prosjektet, blir jeg nå frikjøpt fra forskerdelen av CETT. Dette medfører at jeg vil fortsette å administrere CETT, mens min forskertid vil bli benyttet til prosjektet "men det kningen.

- Prosjektet går på å benytte Schrödingerlingningen, som beskriver hvordan kvantemekaniske syste-

standing surfaces and interfaces".

mer utvikler seg med tiden. Målet er å bruke fysiske ligninger til å forske på hvordan molekylmodeller oppfører seg på en overflate. Med en slik modell kan en på sikt kanskje se hvordan et kreftmolekyl beveger seg på en cellemembran. Vi skal altså skape modeller som andre forskere kan bruke i sine egne forskerprosjekt, utdyper Ruud.

På mitt spørsmål om dette kan løse den berøm-

melige kreftgåten, blir Ruud noe mer uklar, men det er tydelig at det ikke er noen direkte hindringer for at spesialister innen andre fagfelt kan få et kraftig forskerredskap som kan løse problemer som tidligere har vært vanskelig å studere

- Vi har fått tildelt 1,5 mill euro til dette prosjektet. Det er mye penger, men det

skal gå til dekke av lønn for 2 PhD-studenter i tillegg til 2 post.doc. stillinger – i tillegg til min forskerdel. Heldigvis har vi en solid maskinpark ved UiT, ellers hadde dette ikke gått. Prosjektet skal gå over 5 år, men det er likevel bare begynnelsen på denne forskningen. Er vi heldige, har vi de første modellene klare om en 2-3 år. Skal vi komme lengre til bunns i problematikken, må vi nok få lengre tid på oss til å komme med forbedrede modeller.

Witchcraft and Wizardry

The University of Tromsø is a unique place not only for its geographical location. Another reason is a fact that the UiT offers various unique programmes and subjects that are difficult to find anywhere else in Norway. Or more – anywhere in the rest of the world. One of them is Contemporary Witchcraft, a subject taught at the Department for History and Religious studies opened for the first time in the Autumn semester 2011.

he idea of implementing this subject into curricula of the Department originated in mind of Mr. James R. Lewis.

Lewis, born in Maryland and raised in Florida, is a professor and a professional writer with a specialization in New Age and new religious movements. Lewis was introduced to paganism when he first arrived in California. He met one of the founders of the pagan traditions. He started visiting his gatherings and became interested in paganism.

Pagans before Christians and secrets of witches

Contemporary witchcraft is a modern movement. People who participate in the contemporary movement call themselves pagans, so it is normal to use the word paganism instead. The movement star-

--Particularly people who are involved in religion often want something about ancient credentials, something that makes it more real, true to a lot of people. I discovered a secret group of witches that have been pratising this since before Christianity came. And they initiated me into their secrets, says Lewis.

This claims that contemporary paganism was the religion people were aware of before the Christians came.

People who got involved in paganism were often people who had some negative experience with Christianity. It all seemed very exciting for them because things that were magical.

Paganism expansion and the role of the internet

Paganism has expanded to the USA during the 1960's and people looked at it as religion being closely associated to the natural rhythms. Nature is an important element of the paganism beliefs. It became a major religious noninstitutionalized movement. There were no churches or anything like that. The movement was rather decentralized and paganism was practised by small groups of people. With time moving along, also the organizations changed. These day

paganism is practised by individuals, by people alone rather than by groups. Lewis says that this has been a large part of the results of the internet which now is a place where one can interact most often with other pagans. They arrange pagan

festivals, pagan conferences, camps etc. It also became a major phenomenon in the Eastern Eruopean countries, where they started studying it.

Paganism has started as a formal subject in the UK and the USA thanks to people who were interested in it. Though as an disorganized and non-institutionalized movement, the pagans have no seminary. In the mid 90's there were couple of anthologies published. However, the whole era of pagan studies received a lot of criticism because almost everybody who is involved in these studies is

the people who practised paganism did a pagan himself. Many of the scholars went to schools and got their PhD's. Nevertheless, there are not so many of them who hold positions at universitites. There are some, though.

> These scholars started a journal published by Equinox, a British publisher. Only around five people starting this journal are not pagans. The criticism the movement received was based on arguments that it is good to have insiders to do a scholarship but in the field where almost everybody is an insider, it creates imbalance.

> --Despite that, it seems to me, they only produce a good scholarship, adds

Pagans and a "unpopular celebrity" at the univeresity

As stated before, Contemporary Witchcraft is a new subject introduced to the UiT. It has been running from the beginning of the Autumn semester 2011. Lewis nevertheless says that there are problems with low registration:

--It seems that other places where I taught, religious studies usually had a reputation that it is interesting. So people signed up for religion courses. Here the departement is relatively new. The last Rektor had an interest in religion and he initiated the department. We feel good when we can get 6 people in a graduate class.

The students who now take Contemporary Witchcraft are all international students. Anybody can come and participate. The Norwegian law allows all nonstudents to attend any kind of classes.

Famous Varg Vikernes aka Kristian Larsson Vikernes, ambient and black metal musician known for his one-man band Burzum and popular band Mayhem, who besides that is also convinced murderer and responsible for burning down old Norwegian wooden churches, served his jail-time in Tromsø and used to come over and attend some lectures at the department. He was mostly described as a good and an intelligent student who actively participated and contributed well during the lectures.

Witchcraft and Satanism?

And how is Lewis satisfied with the course so far? Did the subject fulfill his expectations? He says that the participants who take this course are good students, but he adds:

--I set it up to attract a lot of students, and it did not attract that many. I taught the course Religion and Violence last term and it attracted around 14, 15 students, which is a lot for religious studies. I thought with witchcraft there would be the same kind of response. I do not know if I will teach it in the future again. Maybe if I called it something like Witchcraft and Satanism more students would sign up."

mnesty International is an international Organization that acts as a watchdog on institutions that violates **human rights across the globe.** The Tromsø branch of this advocacy group is indeed very vibrant and beams its searchlight on all corners of the world where violations of human rights goes on daily. The slogan among this group on campus is "take action" where and when there is a perceived or direct human right violation anywhere. In Africa, the group has continuously exposed the killings, torture and deprivations in various regions. Presently, this group has beamed it searchlight and taken an action on the proposed execution of Troy Davis, a man found 'guilty' of murdering a police officer in Georgia, USA in 1991. Almost all members of the jury during the trial has recanted and accused the police of undue pressure to extract false information; yet the Georgia state still wants to go ahead with the execution. Amnesty International Student Network has tremendously supported its parent group in kicking against the proposed execution billed to come up on 21st September. Of course, being an advocate myself, I was there to 'take an action'.

Speaking with Lise-Hennie Berdal, the leader of the group during an interactive meeting in Café Bodega, she confirmed that the group is not only involved in campaign against violence and torture but also works to expose other forms of deprivation going on in places like Nairobi Kenya where there was forceful eviction of citizens from their houses. Their activities here in Tromsø revolves around the campus and the city center where in some cases

like the Nairobi situation and the present Troy Davies predicament, signatures were taken and sent to the appropriate quarters to register their position on the issue. They have also been actively involved in campaigns for improved maternal health care and adequate social infrastructures to improve the lots of citizens in developing nations.

The group also has a bumper package running throughout the semester. Of particular interest is the concert at Driv to be chaired by the Amnesty General Secretary, John Peder Egenæs during which human right award will be awarded. The group also plans a campaign to promote corporate social responsibility among companies in Norway, particularly the oil companies. Ideally speaking, the group has not disappointed in its responsibility and discharge of duties to humanity. Thumbs up!

The issue of human right violations is as old as humanity but has gained momentum following the various revolutions and wars that has threatened humanity with undue deprivation and extermination. Following the catastrophic effect of the Second World War, nation states got together under the umbrella of United Nations to articulate ideas and ways to protect lives and property in a world that apparently is in a precarious balance. This led to the emergence of three international legal instruments adopted by the UN to guard against actions that threaten our fundamental and natural rights. Much as this sounds very encouraging, there have been persistence violations of rights of citizens by state actors and non-state actors alike in various countries; daring the invocation of the international legal instruments but of



ross violation of human rights has largely dominated discourse in the international organizations like the UN. Various advocacy groups have consistently spoken out in unison condemning the atrocities going on presently, particularly the carnage in Arab world,

notable among them in Libya and Syria. The refugee question has persisted in the Middle East and one is never sure if Palestine will be granted statehood, and by extension an identity. Right to life, food and adequate shelter has remained too elusive. People in some parts of the world seem to be living on borrowed time in a world that equality, fairness and justice ought to reign supreme.



In parts of Somalia, droughts and famine has wreaked havoc on the people and the Al-Shabab rebel group has complicated issues by blocking entrance of foreign aides to most affected places. Majority of the people in Southern Somalia apparently live at the mercy of the al-shabab that dictates when food and water comes in a particular area. Quite regrettable you would say, but that is the stark reality facing many Somalis particularly in Southern Somalia. 

his group with the support of students in Norway, Norad, Operation's Day's Work, LNU and FOKUS gets deeply involved in activities that encourages or support knowledge. SAIH which has branches across institutions in Norway work to improve the lots of youth; particularly in Southern Africa and Latin America in the area of capacity building and empowerment through education. No wonder its motto remains "education for liberation" for the past fifty years. Their support for infrastructural development has also been felt in countries like Zimbabwe, Zambia, South Africa, Bolivia and Nicaragua.

Their activities in these regions has largely been made possible by funds from students in Norway and other public spirited institutions like NORAD, Operation's Days Work, LNU and FOKUS. They have succeeded through partnership strategies in providing education and mentoring to the people of the regions where they are concentrating. Of course, part of education involves being aware of your rights as a human being and knowing your duties as citizen of a state and this is where SAIH comes in as an advocacy group. It is quite strategic and in line with human conscience that the group is also involve in calling to halt the activities of the countries of the North whose economic ventures and otherwise does not encourage equality, fairness and

just society in the South.

man Right at Present

We have various places in Africa that wanton violation of human remains is prevalent. Nigeria for example for decades has been characterized with gross human right abuses. The conflicts and attacks coming from militant sects in the northern part of the country is indeed worrisome and has threatened the democratic framework of the African state. We are also yet to hear the last of former president of Cote d'Ivoire, Laurent Gbabo who was ousted by French supported Pro-Quatarra forces in the wake of the conflict that occurred after Gbabo refused to relinquish power peacefully after losing in an election to Quattarra in December last year. There is every indication that he will be a guest of the International Criminal Court in Hague in the nearest future, considering that Ivorian Judiciary deems it fit.

Generally speaking, there have been tremendous developments in the fight against human right abuses at all levels of our societies. In Norway, particularly in Tromsø and more precisely in University of Tromsø, as we have seen in the analysis, the various advocacy groups have contributed immensely to gross human right abuse in all parts of the world. Amnesty International Student Network, Spire, FN-Studentene and SAIH has gotten deeply engaged in activities aimed at promoting respect for human right, not Just in Norway but in other continents like Africa and surprisingly in USA where the more than two hundred year old democracy is again being put to test in Georgia over the execution of one man that from all indications is very much innocent.in the past and more in the offing aimed at promoting the culture of respect of human rights.

In places like Zambia, SAIH has worked with Norwegian government to provide teachers, educational and medical infrastructures to improve learning. As the saying goes, an educated society is well armed and ready for developmental challenges.

Spire Tromsø local chapter

pire is the newest human rights youth organization in Tromsø. Norway's development foundation had their first meetings in 1971, but they needed a slight push from "operation days work" in 2003 before they started their own youth organization – Spire.

> Spire has since then been based in Oslo, but has this autumn started new local groups in Bergen, Trondheim and Tromsø. The group in Tromsø therefore contains only a handful members, and are eager to invite all who wants to participate in humans right into their fold.

> Spire work on issuses concerning environment and development through spreading awareness, and by advocacy. Spires work is focused on trade, agriculture and the environment.

> Spire's goal is to change the structures in the world that up hold injustice in the world. Spire, as a youth group, works in specific ways to reach this goal. They want to be a meetingplace, where their members can create social and professional rooms, where active and committed youth can inspire each other addressing global questions as a common platform.



Cooperation between the Counselling Center and the Peace Center promises social and academic help for new students.

he mentorship project for the Peace Center is based on feedback of previous years' students who expressed that they wish to have better and more frequent interraction between the first year and second years students. Following the students request, the CPS has now made the first step and pursued the idea of mentorship within the program.

The idea is that each of the first year students will be given a mentor from the second year in order to create a safe place for discussing academic and social issues. The student's mentors felt very positive and open towards this idea. They expressed that they had wished for more "direct" support and more opportunities

for having discussions from somebody from the CPS when they started their studies.

The mentors' roles will be more important because of the motivational function they will maintain. They will not only serve as guides, as a safe place for

the first year students for discussions and debates, but also as role models for the first year students. They can show new students that the demanding studies are managable, that it is possible to get projects and exams done on time and succeed within the program.

gramme. Students will be divided into groups and will decide how often and where they want to meet. Each mentor group will consist of 3-4 first year students. The Peace Center has so far gotten

9 volunteer mentors. The programme will run for the next 8 weeks and the minimum requirement for etings is once a week.

The mentorship is completely in the students hands. Nevertheless, Mr. Eirik Hjulstad Iversen, Higher Execu-

tive Officer for the CPS informed that the CPS will help if required:

--We will help the mentors with any ideas. They are not supposed to be supervisors or academic experts. They are someone who has taken the same subjecst last year, and they know the Peace Center, and they know Tromsø. In the beginning the plan is to start discussing

Mangelen på studentbolger er alarmerende, fordi flere og flere studenter kommer til Tromsø hvert år. Av nye studenter ønsket universitetet 2500 norske og rundt 317 internasjonale studenter velkommen i år. SiTo har 10 studentbloger tilgjengelige med mer enn 1506 rom til leie - 1085 hybler og 421 leiligheter av ulike størrelser.

En sofa å sove på

Lena Fjellvang fra Driv og resten av styret som arrangerte DebutUka, var ansvarlig for opprettelsen av Sofahjelpen. Det er et Facebook-prosjekt som gjør det mulig for studenter som har behov for et sted å bo å legge inn innlegg, der de spør etter sofaplass i en leilighet eller hybel. Det var stor respons til de fleste forespørslene.

Den store Sofahjelp-ideen reddet mange studenter fra å være uten tak over hodet de første dagene i Tromsø. Det betydde også at studentene flyttet inn i noens andres leilighet bare for noen uker eller måneder. Dette enten fordi leietakere ikke kunne leie leiligheten for lengre tid, eller fordi noen heldige studentene fikk plass på en studentbolig etter å ha vært lenge på ventelisten.

Unødvendig stress

For noen som er ny i en ukjent by, er hele situasjon veldig stressende. Å starte et semester i et fremmed hus der man egentlig ikke har privatliv er imidlertid bedre enn ikke å ha noe sted å bo i det hele tatt. Større problemer kommer med de internasjonale studentene, alt er mange ganger vanskeligere for dem. Å tilpasse seg i det nye hjemmet fullt av nordmenn kan for noen av de internasjonale studentene være en opplevelse de ønsker å unngå, hvertfall på begynnelsen av sitt opphold i Norge.

UiT har nylig uttrykt sitt bekymring over de nye internasjonale studentene som kommer til Tromsø uten å ha et sted å bo. Det var derfor nødvendig å ta noen tiltak;

Ingen garanterte studentboliger

Den tillatte grensen for å akseptere de internasjonale studentene har vært 250 i lang tid. Antallet av aksepterte internasjonale studenter dette året er 317. Dette krever et kritisk blikk på de beslutningene som UiT gjør. Mr.Hans Petter Kvaal, administrerende direktør for studentsamskipnaden, sier at ingen av de studenter som går over grensen, blir garantert en studentbolig. Han sier også at SiTo planlegger store prosjekter.

En ny studentbolig til campus

--For å løse fremtidige problemer med manglende plasser på studentboliger, er SiTo for tiden i en viktig dialog med Universitet, informerer Kvaal.

Sito prøver å få en fri plass i nærheten av campus hvor en ny studentbolig kan bygges opp. Kvaal sier at det er viktig å bygge opp boligene nær campus ikke bare på grunn av å øke mengden av boligplasser, men også for å øke komforten for studentene. De vil bo nær Kraft, biblioteket osv.

Alt avhenger likevel av en universitetsavgjørelse og at en ledig plass for bygningen blir funnet. SiTo har søkt om ekstra lån for å bygge de nye studentboligene.

A call for peace

The anniversary of the 9/11 terror attack has triggered discussions among students of UiT. Together with the leader of the UN-students, they maintain that global peace must start with the individual.

The 9/11 terror attacks were a great loss for the prospect of world peace. However, the students believe that there is always hope.

Students' perspective on peace

Temmy Ayo Aladeokin, a Nigerian master student of the Peace and Conflict Transformation states:

- By asking yourself how to create peace, you already put your focus on peace. It becomes your field of attention. Just as some people focus on the terror of terrorism. When we start thinking of ways to be more peaceful, we are already creating peace.

- We all must begin to respect one another. But in fact, it begins with the individual, he adds.

Suik Jung, a South Korean student of the Peace and Conflict Transformation program says:

-- The easiest and the simplest way to achieve peace is to improve our conversations about equality, rather than talking about our differences. This would help the world avoid conflict.

- Personally, I also think that building peace in our societies begins with small actions of the individual. For example, we might start with an attempt to eliminate discrimination from people's minds.

Sometimes pride, sometimes shame

The terrorists are usually on a mission, and they do not act without reason. Terrorism always seems to be the act of a twisted mind outside of society's control. It is the reason why we feel so helpless- we cannot control the actions, thinking or behavior of other people.

An anonymous student says:

- We must remember that our nationalities, ethnicity, religious affiliations, and other labels may sometimes bring us pride, and may mark us with shame some other times. But our humanity will always be there.

Peace education of the youth

Even Norway is not immune to terrorist attacks. During the commemoration of the World Trade Center tragedy in the United

States, authorities and ordinary citizens related the recent tragedy in Oslo, and called for increased humanity and a renewed spirit of brotherhood. The Oslo-Utøya tragedy emphasized an important message: we must pay more attention to the peace education of youth.

Temmy Ayo Aladeokin says:

- The recent terrorism in Norway attacked the independent government. Freedom of association and the spirit of youth has been targeted. These values are dear to Norwegians. They intend to defend themselves so that in the future, Norway will be recognizable as the accommodating, safe and peaceful country they've always known.

The UN-students union on Campus

The UN-students' organization is an important component of the local community. They lead a mission of spreading peace among students, and taking part in other peaceful actions. When asked how to promote peace, Erika Steinholt Mortensen, the leader of the UN-students responded that:

- We should learn from history and from what the older generations have done before us. We should pay attention to what worked out and what failed. Also, the UN-students can promote peace by encouraging communication between the parties and by creating an even dialogue— which requires tolerance and respect for other people's beliefs and histo-

TODOS, Tromsø Doctoral Students, have taken a great initiative this week and organized an open debate about how to improve PhD supervision.

ODOS is an organization that works for the welfare of all **PhD students at the UiT.** The board consists of several PhD students, Ralph Kube, Melania Borit, Lene Østvand, Henry Pinedo, Ranjan Parajuli and Hanne Sigrun Byhring. Wednesday's late afternoon meeting revealed many ideas that, if implemented, would improve the supervision system at UiT.

This open debate about supervision was a follow-up to a survey regarding the qualitites of a good supervisor. All parties participated in the debate – PhD supervisors, PhD students and the administration of UiT.

Another reason for the debate was awareness of the fact that although most of the PhD students are rather satisfied

with their supervisors, there are too many cases when a supervisor and a student cannot find the connection they need to have, either for cultural or other reasons. There are many students at the UiT who do not finish their PhD work on time or who extend their studies even up to 8 years.

Not to be too kind

For the above-mentioned reasons, it was concluded that it is necessary to be honest with each other and not to be afraid to speak up if something goes wrong. In other words, if a student is obviously not

able to finish his/ her work, either because of repeated extensions or because there is no potential in him/ her, it is important that the supervisor just says 'stop, it is better if you quit'. Nevertheless, it needs to go the other way around as well. If there is no potential in a supervisor who is too busy or his education is not relevant for the students' research, it is necessary that the students express their worries to the relevant body, no matter where the student is in the writing progress.

The good and the bad supervision

Pål Vegar Storeheier, Director of the Department of Research and Development revealed an alarming statistic: that only 25% of the students have regular weekly meetings with their supervisors. Some of them have the meetings only sporadically. He is, however, quite pleased that the survey informed that these

meetings are sufficiently long. It is nevertheless disturbing that 67% the students say that the supervision takes 'base ad hoc', which means on the students initiative. Only 11% say that they have an appointment schedule and then have some ad hoc meetings in addition to this pre-determined schedule.

Storeheirer emphasizes that he would prefer if all the PhD students had scheduled meetings.

Supervision in the rest of the world

Ralph Kube, PhD student from the In-

stitute for Physics and Technology, presented a system of supervision courses in other countries, for example the Netherlands, Ireland, Sweden etc. Most of the supervisors in these countries get an adequate training on how to relate to his/her students during the PhD program. In Uppsala (Sweden) for example, supervisors attending a training course have to reflect on their personal approach to supervision.

This triggered a discussion on the qualities that distinguish an exceptional supervisor. This fictional supervisors need to show qualitites as a scientist, mentor, administrator and manager. It is unlikely that a single person shows all these qualities simultaneously.

It was concluded that the best idea on how to improve the supervision system at UiT would be if a student had more than two supervisors. Then it is almost sure that a student will

get all he needs.

Education for supervi-

An important element of PhD supervision is that not only do the students operate closely with the

supervisor, and the idea that they should have more than one, but also that the supervisors educate themselves how to become the best supervisors they can be. It is a difficult task which is demanding of one's time and requires the whole scale of various skills. Storeheier informed that Kari Agren from the University of Umeå will come to Tromsø on the 1st of

November 2011. The university Umeå in Sweden holds courses for supervisors. They are not obligatory but supervisors may learn how to go through texts, how to behave as a leader and so on. Agren will hold a presentation about their experience with these courses and the results. The UiT plans on arranging the same courses in Tromsø.



multimedia courses from Pakistan, I decided to take higher education from any high income country. My decision was primarily based on the assumption that the quality of education is superior in the high income countries. That assumption was soon to be tested in the northern most university in the world. MPhil Visual Cultural studies program at the University of Tromsø seemed like a good combination of social science, and video production, so I came with

enormous motivation to learn a lot of new things.

The classes began with focus on learning the technical aspects of filming and the theoretical aspects of visual anthropology. I soon realized that I have learned the technical aspects of filming much better in Pakistan, but the

main issue was converting from a demographer to anthropologist.

As a demographer, I was used to looking at the world in terms of empirical and concrete data. After taking several lectures related to anthropology, I soon made three initial conclusions. First, either some of the lecturers need therapy, or they need to see the world beyond their own research projects. Second, the teachers need to pass an IELTS or TOEFL test, something which is required by every international student from a non-EU country. And third, what is this 'something' they talk about again and again?

Teachers used the word 'something' at least 20 times in a class to point to a 'something' concept, which does not have a specific name yet. I came to learn

that anthropology is probably the branch of social sciences and humanities which tends to study culture with such depths that no concepts can explain anything anymore. All there is left is 'something' related to 'something'. I was not the only one having these crises. Out of my five class fellows, only one had studied anthropology before;

the rest had backgrounds as diverse as 'English literature', 'Education',' Sociology' and even 'Law'. One can imagine the quality and focus of discussions in a class with such diverse backgrounds.

In the second semester here at the University of Tromsø, I decided to look for courses beyond my department. I consider myself very fortunate to have enrolled myself in a 'research methods' course taught by Floyd Rudmin. Finally, I met a teacher in Norway who actually loves his job, and is damn good at it. Apart from what he taught, he gave the passion for research to me. It was probably then that I decided that I should still try to study another degree, and le-

arn something I'd be satisfied with. Isn't that what we look for in a teacher? Inspiration?

The overall experience of studying in Norway did not impress me at all. I thought I could not take this anymore, and decided to apply to other degree programmes elsewhere in the world for the next year. To my surprise, I even managed to get scholarship offers from U.K, and a world renowned institute in Thailand

Meanwhile, here in Tromsø, the luck was on my side, and I got Peter Crawford as my supervisor. I decided that I should not leave things incomplete, and finish

this degree instead. In some months, I had started to observe and analyze social situations, and look for 'somethings' to explain a culture myself. The teachers had succeeded in their task, and I could now analyze social life and culture in shades of grey as well (of course, the black and white are best measured with numbers :-). I was glad that I continued to study in Tromsø, and did not leave for a different degree elsewhere.

One and a half year after, I embarked upon the same problem, and purposely wrote a thesis draft, full of theories, concepts and 'something's'. I am grateful to my supervisor, Peter Crawford, for making me realize in good time, that I am making things much more complex than they are (apparently there was a limit, even in anthropology), and that I need to stay in touch with reality, or more appropriately, the data that I have collected during my field work. It was a like a déjà vu. I have become exactly what I hated about some of my lecturers in the first year.

Two years passed, and I finished the degree with flying colors (I still wonder how that happened). My film got screened in more than a dozen festivals around the world, and I managed to draft several articles

out of my thesis, one of which has already been published.

I have become exactly what I hated about some of my lecturers in the first year.

I have successfully finished the never ending degree. I could now appreciate the importance and relevance of qualitative, image-based research, which took two years to learn and understand.

As was expected, the choice of studying MPhil Visual Cultural Studies was not a very practical one. We had a joke in the

class, that if someday we find a job vacancy asking for "visual anthropologists", it must be a prank by any of our class fellows.

To secure the unlimited supply of junk food on my table, I enrolled myself in another Masters degree, specializing in quantitative research. I'm not done with Tromsø yet. The journey still goes on.....

Ask not what ISU can do for you, but what you can do for ISU

his article is a response to the article written by Magdalena Budinova, on page 10 of the 8-14 September 2011 edition of the Utropia.

Her article highlighted the low attendance of the ISU election held on Monday 30th of August 2011, despite the high publicity of the event via ISU Facebook group and invitation notification to students through email. In her article she raised salient points about why the attendance was low although publicity was high. As an international student and one time board member of the ISU (though for a short while), I deem it expedient to also contribute to ways that ISU can be more vibrant and help meet the needs of international students. This article therefore is to echo some of the issues raised by Magdalene and also to add other suggestions that can help increase the patronage of ISU programme by international students.

ISU's Good Deeds

The main aims of ISU which is "improve the lives of all new comers in Tromsø in a social context, help them integrate better and to offer experience of new things which are otherwise expensive, not easily reachable or organizationally challenging to students" should be given extreme focus and highlighted enough in the advertising materials and via Facebook to enable newcomers get acquainted with the core values of ISU. The various past programmes and activities organized by ISU, using photos, animations and more catchy presentations tools should be used on the ISU website to attract more students to the website and also read what the content is. Detailed line up of the current programmes for the ISU should also be planned and advertised so that new comers can know what preliminarily to expect from the ISU within the semester.

ISU Election Process

As stated in Magdalena's article, "as of 5 o'clock, the said time for the election, preparation was just starting". This incident either irritates students who had had a busy day on the beginning of the week and are just itchy to go home. This means that adequate measures should be put in place ensure strict adherence to time. I suggest that students who want to stand for positions in the ISU board should read about detail requirements of the position they want to stand for (meaning detail information should have be provided by the ISU advertisement medium). Then they can apply online and vetted by a select committee and given feedback before the

election time. Then students know who are contesting for the various positions prior to the election time to enable them who to vote for and also for the contestants to prepare enough to present themselves to the students on the election day.

ISU Board


I suggest that besides the dedicated student who are elected to the ISU board, there should be a patron either from the international student office, student parliament or the counseling department to give expert advice and help streamline the programmes to suit the interest and taste of the international students. The patron can also help the ISU to source funding for the ISU. As an ex-board member I can say for a fact that sometimes ISU either lacks funding for some programmes or has funding but lacks the required programme to use the funds to organize.

Transparency in ISU

ISU obtain funding from different sources to run the semester programmes. Among these sources including the 20 kroner that every student who agree to pay when paying for the semester registration fees to contribute to the ISU funds. This means that it is obligatory for the ISU to furnish the student body with the detail accounts of how the funding they receive is used. This could be audited accounts that can be published in Utropia at the end of every semester. This will encourage transparency in the ISU funds, encourage student concern at least.

In conclusion, I can say that ISU is a very wonderful union, without which most international students would have not been able to integrate better and enjoy experience of new things otherwise expensive as Magdalena puts it. Therefore all effort must be made by all and sundry to help it achieve its objectives for the betterment of all students.





espite the fact that posters had been pinned all over town way in advance, the final line-up of the jubille concert was kept secret up until just a couple of days before the actual event. Rock out at the Bastard

riday night was a busy night at

Bastard. Not only were hangersby aggregating at Tromsø's underground rock bar to socialize and
drink over-expensive beer (70 Nok a pint),
but also to vibrate at the raw energy of live
Rock'n Roll. Tonight's bill consisted of Dull
Boy Jack and Ivvár, two combos whose
existence I was completely unaware of.

It seems that I might have been the only one in this case, as Ivvár seemed to have quite a following and managed to lure around 60 people to attend their show. The quartet, made up of four young clean and short haired boys, took the stage at around 23, 30 and quickly showed their true colors. The band basically proposed some kind of soft rock focused on mid-tempo songs, filled with pop-oriented guitar harmonies and relatively high pitched singing. The band mates were definitely competent in this specific area of expertise, and played their songs quite correctly as the evening unfolded. Despite the cruel lack of truly intimate melodies or catchy choruses, Ivvár received hugely positive feedback from the audience and left the stage after a little more than half an hour of music.

A short while afterwards came Dull Boy Jack. Judging from the opening performance, one might have been scared of having to face more slow-paced pop music, but one could not have been more wrong! As soon as the bass player began plucking his 6-stringed instrument, Dull Boy Jack revealed itself to be at the complete opposite of the musical spectrum. The sole fact that he entered the stage with such a weapon of sonic warfare provided a good indication of the band's musical orientation in the first place.

For about an hour, the Boys electrified the atmosphere with their smelly Rock'n Roll that could be best described as a groovy Hard Rock directly influenced by the 90's alternative and funky scene. This impression was reinforced tenfold as the singer proceeded to fill the stage with his mix of powerful rock vocals and the charisma of those who live their music at 100 per cent. Song after song, the band kept the pressure as high as possible, leaving just a little breathing space for mid-paced tracks and well-placed neck-busting breaks.

Dull Boy Jack's music was, in short, groovy and straightforward Rock'n Roll. Despite a relative lack of variation (especially towards the end of the set), they showcased a highly communicative energy. Keep an eye on this band because Dull Boy Jack ain't a synonym of bullshit. You've been warned.

hen I heard that Rumble in Rhodos was set to play in Tromsø this month, I could hardly contain my emotions. The band's last Full-Length was indeed a great piece of music: melodic, straightforward and, all in all, a stark success. The concert component of the second Heledriv night was announced for eleven in the evening, and featured the unknown (at least for me) Ungdomskulen from Bergen.

Arriving at Driv a couple of hours too early (I had no better place to go and a big paperback to finish), I was able to witness the increasing number of scantily-clad women and clean-shaven post-teens aggregating for the "Pink evening", as well as the unfortunate (yet unavoidable) coming of Driv's evil dance music. The whole house was soon crammed with people and filled with obnoxious contemporary dance sounds. Fortunately, it was about time for the concert to begin.

Ungdomskulen's members stepped in first. One drummer, one bass player, one guitarist and a great deal of mastery. The

power trio unleashed their ferocious music without consideration for our unprepared ears. While I was expecting some kind of soft post-new wave with indie overtones, Ungdomskulen proved itself to be an overwhelming wave of sound, brutally crushing

the few bold enough to withstand the charge. All of the band's songs were fast-paced hymns driven by sprawling bass and weird guitar melodies. I distinguished bits of Zappa in their farcical stage attitude and hints to the Noise-Norse scene in their chaotic yet crushing sound. Songs like "Spartacus" and "Modern Drummer" were so moving that some crazies even started a mosh-pit! This speaks volumes about the power the band exudes in its stage performance.

Coming in right afterwards, Rumble in Rhodos immediately attracted a good amount of hangers-by to the front of the

stage. One guy was particularly enthused, banging his blond head back and forth at lethal doses for most of the show. He was either a really hardcore fan or high on crack-cocaine. Still, it was not the overreacting fan, but the sound that posed the most problems during the show. While the band's recorded music could be described as a soulful web of fiery crafted melodies, this show had a more direct rock sound- though, most of the lead vocals were hindered by the constant groa ning of an overriding bass guitar. Slight fuck-up, M. Soundman. Despite these minor inadequacies, the show went on for the better, starting with "We celebrate the abundance", the opening track of the band's last album. "White Dancing", "Soft insulated days"- to the delight of your correspondent, all of the band's last album's songs were played alongside some worthy oldies. It was great to see the sextet giving everything they had in the name of music. Seeing Rumble in Rhodos live was definitely a moving experience. You'd better not miss them next time they're in town. Or at the very least, run to get their album. This band is worth a try.

Joik under dark skies

Through a short yet mesmerizing show Adjagas reminds us of their musical craftsmanship

he Pop and Rock constituent of the one-day festival began with the ascending heroes of Sámi music, Adjagas. In retrospective, it is quite weird to think that such a famed band was put so low on the bill, as more obscure combos were offered the headlining positions. Despite this line-up oddity, the band was definitely sought after and managed to attract between 50 and 60 spectators to their short set.

Though their performance was brief, the sextet was fully prepared and gave a nearly flawless performance. As the show began, one could hear that even the sound mix was almost perfect- giving only a little bit too much prominence to the bass at the detriment of the banjo. However, this detail quickly disappeared from everyone's mind as the show progressed. Almost all of the songs were re-arranged to various extents from their studio recordings. Most were

given a joltier rhythm as well as a slightly higher tempo. Even those songs that remained most faithful to the recordings were often enriched by newly interpreted instrumental lines, such as the majestic trumpet solo of "Hás it!". The Joikers performed with equal prevalence during the set. Sara Marielle Gaup was more prominent at the show's beginning, while Lawra Somby took over more lead-vocal duties towards the end.

Unfortunately, the band had to end their show after only half an hour of music. Lawra Somby led the closing piece "Mánu Rávdnji ", a beautiful folk song based upon an old Sea-Sámi traditional melody. Despite the ungodly shortness of Adjagas' set, the band still managed to make the audience travel with them throughout their mystical universe. It was a good teaser for everyone until their next performance, probably somewhere between the Sámi week and the Påskefestivalen. You'd better be there, or be a fool!

arpaint's sound is sweet, melancholic and spooky at the same time. The hypnotizing character of some songs in fact bears something ominous that reminds me of sirens and their will-less victims. Their voices are just too sweet to resist, the sound wide enough to get lost in. The four ladies, originally from Los Angeles California, found their very own space in the universe with its own definition of time. Each of the songs celebrates slowness as if there was no time at all. In this world of eternal twilight they know how to walk without touching the earth.

What protects this mysterious world from fuzziness is the sharp precision of the rhythm and the passion for detail in the composition of the different sounds around it. That is why Warpaint's music seems to cross the borders to electronic music and in some way brings Radiohead to my mind. According to Emily Kokal, the singer and founder of Warpaint, electronic music is the new classical music and a possible future way for the band. She believes that electronic music gives the mind a greater possibility to travel further for it is not bound to some traditional song structures. It is as well its own

Besides the excellent skills of drummer Stella Mozgawa and bassist Jenny Lee Lindberg, there is this light and at the same time headstrong sound of two guitars (Kokal, Theresa Wayman) that echoes into the wide open space like sparks of light into darkness. So metimes in a shy, melancholic way reminiscent of an early The Cure; sometimes in a playful, funky and kinky way that resembles the Red Hot Chili Peppers. The latter might be the result of a close cooperation between Warpaint and the RHCP's guitarist Josh Klinghoffer, who was one of the early members of Warpaint, and an ex-quitarist-John Frusciante, who mixed their debut EP Exquisite Corpse (released 2008). While the debut is a bit more experimental in the directions it takes, in their follow-up, first full album The Fool (released 2010) Warpaint definitely found their very own, special sound. The magic about their music is that it lives in the gap that lies in between contradictions where everything is possible. It is the perfect cure when life becomes too narrow...and Tromsø too dark

elissa Horn har på 3 år gått fra å være totalt ukjent, til å bli en av Sveriges største musikalske eksportartikler. Tidligere i sommer spilte hun på Buktafestivalen, og nå i høst har hun en stor turne i Skandinavia.

Le cul entre deux chaises

fter playing at this season's first Dreamcatcher night the British Pop band Rubylux was nice enough to surrender one exem-Aplary of their debut album, "Fake Control". Touched by such a generous move, Utropia's culture staff agreed on giving the CD an attentive listen.

So, to begin with, Rubylux, as it is accordingly stated by the band itself, has little or nothing to do with the contemporary "Indie" scene. Maybe as a result of their self-estrangement of the UK's most active scene, Rubylux is still relatively unknown by many British Pop fanatics which seems in total inadequacy with the band's self-assessed mainstream sound.

The Brighton quartet indeed showcases on "Fake Control" a real competence in crafting mature yet direct pop tunes that could virtually appeal to any popular music amateur. The secret of this very accessible sound lies in the band's cunning knowledge in instrumentation. While the rhythm section is brightly produced and always fitting, the remaining soundscape is filled with the leading melodies of the keyboard and the guitar. As the latter morphs from melodic lines ("Reconnect life") into dynamic choruses ("Westminster"), the keyboard acts as a fundamental side-kick, either through the setting of vast aerial layers of sound or by the use of more radio-friendly electronic gimmicks.

The only real problem I can see in Rubylux's album is that in spite of the obvious radio-potential most of their songs do have; the final product still lacks a really strong foundation. The electronic influences on the one hand and the more dreamy landscapes on the other one hardly go well with each other and one can easily feel that Rubylux has, as we say in French, "le cul entre deux chaises" ("The arse in between two chairs"). This slight flaw should however not deter those who rejoice themselves in listening to mainstream pop music as Rubylux could wholly satisfy their radio-friendly musi-

tumfilmdager has been a fixture in TIFF's, and indeed Tromsø city's, calendar going on six years now. Some might say that that is quite an achievement considering the genre, which is like a phone booth among smartphones. Do people-especially young people- even understand the concept, let alone want to sit through an hour of monochromatic on-screen silence?

To see, I sat down with Håvard Stangnes who has worked for TIFF since 2004, the last two of which as their Head of Communications, to discuss the inspiration behind the festival and what made it so unique.

The concept of Stumfilmdager, as Stangnes tells it, was borne out of an idea

from the previous chairman of the board. It was based on the already high success of silent films that have been shown at the Tromsø International Film Festival for a number of years prior. In addition, Tromsø has Verdensteateret, which was built as a theatre specifically for silent films. Consequently, it has good acoustics that lends itself superbly to live music.

The situation and social climate was thus ideal and Stumfilmdager came to be. Now celebrating its sixth birthday, it has seen one successful year after the next. Clearly, it is a real positive for the city of Tromsø, which has also been footing some of the bill for producing this event every year alongside private donors. The festival also endeavours to get the future generations excited and culturally-aware with prescreenings of selected films for schools leading up to the opening night.

So, what makes this festival stand out from the pack? In a word, it is the music. "It is more a silent film concert," says Stangnes, with a diverse array of musicians playing "live and loud" rather than having some stale recording synchronised over the top of the films. The musicians sit there with the audience in an already cosy theatre and take their cues from the movies themselves, which can result in some on-the-fly improvisation. Thus, according to Stangnes, "no two screenings are the same."

Moreover, what really sets Stumfilmdager further apart from its peers is the tailormade feel of the whole event. The bands do not regurgitate the original score for the films. Instead, they start from scratch and compose brand new pieces just for the movies. The time they have to achieve such a feat and then practice varies on the bands and their own schedules and con-

traints. However, a week before the start of the festival. the bands descend upon Tromsø to dress rehearse in Verdensteateret.

Clearly, it is just as much a musical experience as it is about what is being projected onto the silver screen. And don't expect bland bands either. As Stangnes

explains, the heart of this yearly festival is the melding of silent films with brand new, eclectic music to produce, as he puts it: a new expression.

Now, if anyone should know about the music line-up, it would be Håvard Stangnes. He himself played with the bluegrass, progressive rock band, Neograss and thrash-metal group, Defender for the opening film, The Lost World (1925). It is interesting to note how the spectrum of musical talent on this year's playlist seems to be geographically focussed around the North. There are groups, such as Love Cult,

hailing from as far afield as Petrozavodsk, Russia: to as close to home as Mara and Gaute, who now call Tromsø their base.

Every year the bands change, with each new entry promising to create their own, unique musical flavour for their chosen film(s). The only criterion for selection is that the band is able to bring something new and interesting that can be entwined with the silent film. However, in some instances, the bands approach TIFF with an idea. This was certainly the case with Tore Morten Andreassen, composer and musician for both Neograss and Defender, when he came to the Tromsø International film festival's committee with an idea for The Lost World.

However, there is one consistent exception to all the rules set out above: Ben Model. By day, he works at MoMA in New York. But his other, not-so-secret identity is that of professional

naire for silent movies. He travels the world to accompany silent films and has been coming to Tromsø's Stumfilmdager every year since the beginning, and hopefully for every year after this one. By comparison to the other bands playing, the selected movies in the festival that get the Model Treatment are more in-line with the traditional 1920s pieces that would have originally gone with the film. Nevertheless, that does not stop him from adding his own take on songs and changing some pieces comple-

As for the films themselves, Stangnes says that it is whatever they can get their hands on. There are very few silent films left in the world, and TIFF is not only looking for good artistic quality, but on the technical side, the chosen film must also be in an adequate screening format. As a result, there is a mixture of movies being

shown on original reels, while others have been converted to digital. Fortunately this year, a real treat came to Stumfilmdager: Metropolis (1927). First screened at the International Film Festival 2011, it was touted a hit among film-goers who packed out the Kulturhus. Riding on this wave of success, TIFF invited the bands back for a re-screening for Stumfilmdager before both film and musicians start their tour of Russia.

With all this talk of the innovative coupling of music and movie, a more consumeroriented question is whether any of it is for sale? There are already two DVDs out for two Russian silent films from past festivals: Vsevolod Pudovkin's The Mother (1926)

> and The End of St. Petersburg (1927). There are also talks of recording the music from The Lost World to put on sale.

> For a long time, silent films have been viewed by many as the pursuit of scholars and cinema

snobs- having become obsolete with the advent of "talkies." But what this festival manages to do is create the greatest safeguard for such historical relics: renewed interest through modernisation. This new expression that Stangnes mentions seems to be a bridge- connecting past to present; making relevant and fresh, films that were considered anything but. The music manages to open up our imagination, which is what engages us with movies. It truly is an experience that is neither wholly cinematic nor orchestral. It is a fluid coalescence of both that forges an incredible event. And hopefully, one that the younger generations will also find cool.

pening nights at film festivals always screen something grand as a promise of equally great and exciting things to come. The music certainly accomplished that, as for the film, the answer is less black-and-white and more sepia.

The film is very loosely based off the book of the same name by sir Arthur Conan Doyle. A boisterous scientist returns from a trip in the Amazon with tall tales of dinosaurs roaming atop a plateau lost in time, much to the chagrin of his colleagues at the Science Academy in London. To prove his claims, he organises a fact-finding party to accompany him back. Where the story deviates significantly from its source material is in the events that occur in the "lost world."

Doyle's story created a rich microcosm on the plateau with two warring tribes- one human and the other half-ape, living in this isolated "Jurassic Park." Unfortunately, this part of the story does not exist in the film, either because the footage has been lost or it was simply written out of the original screenplay.

Regardless of the reasons, what has taken its place is a sequence of events that are both rushed and discombobulated. There is one token ape-man, whose unimportant and ultimately irrelevant story is clumsily spliced around a love triangle involving two friends. This same romantic predicament both hurriedly resolves itself and unbelievably without conflict, before a volcano erupts. Fortunately, there are two men at the base of the plateau who have been busy making a rope to rescue the marooned party. Unfortunately, we do not know who they are or where they came from- thus adding to the confusion. Moreover, the scenes are not helped by the music. While the bands were magnificent, there is a complete disconnect from the film as a whole which serves only to instil further bewilderment among the au-

So, is it a bad film? No. But not because of the story. Go see it for Willis H. O'Brien. Who? The special effects artist who created the dinosaurs and would later go on to create King Kong, and the Loch Ness monster if the final scene of the movie is anything to go by. His creations and effects were decades ahead of their time and are well worth sitting through the hour-long film. His stop-motion, claymation pterodactyl looks like a nightmarish creature straight from Burton's Beetlejuice, and the dinosaur fight scenes look more realistic than much of what CGI is rendering nowadays.

Final verdict: "The Lost World" deserves both preservation and an audience to experience cinematic special effects at their finest, surpassed only by Metropolis. And you will be entertained by the comical Professor Challenger, who remarkably resembles Brian Blessed, while waiting for a glimpse at a brontosaurus.



romsø Stumfilmfestival startet beskjedent onsdag 14. september på Verdensteateret på kvelden. Her ble det vist 2 kortfilmer med live musikk. Musikken ble gitt av saksofonist og lydteknikker, og var med på å gjøre to ganske spesielle filmer til enda mer spesielle og sære.

Dinosaurs fighting to bluegrass

he Lost world was accompanied by music created and performed by the thrash metal band, Defender alongside bluegrass/progrock Neograss. The mixture sounded intriguing. First of all, the two, or rather three music genres don't really come off as easy to mingle. Moreover, the idea of watching dinosaurs fight to thrash metal is also an interesting one. The end product from the two bands was very good, and while at times confusing, it did not ulti-

mately disappoint. I have to admit that the music was first class: proficiently performed, interesting and good. It also fit the overall feel of the movie. The confusion comes from the fact that one cannot really notice many thrash metal inspirations in the "soundtrack." From my perspective, the music seemed more like the mixture of bluegrass and progrock with a little hint of something harsher-more metal or even rock than thrash. For example, I expected the vocalist to scream his lungs out during the dinosaur fight scenes. Another thing with the music is that even though it fit

the movie well, there were some scenes where the "soundtrack" didn't do its job and was confusing the audience rather than complementing the events on the screen. Example: the allosaur/brontosaur fight was accompanied by a terpsichorean-like score and scenes where not much was happening featured rougher and more energetic music. All in all, the experience was enjoyable and I could easily recommend the movie if it was to reappear during the next TIFF (Tromsø Internasjonale Film Festival).

sneaking into Ellen's room to drink her blood. While Murnau used shadow and light to create the unbearable tension and horror, Lang went a step further and incorporated this style of German expressionism into the first sci-fi, dystopian movie that the world has ever seen.

Lang was, no doubt, a visionary director. Even though the city of Metropolis is only a hand-made miniature, its visual impact has amazed generations of cinemagoers ever since. The movie cost 200 million dollars (accounting for inflation) and brought the company producing it on the verge of bankruptcy.

The power of the movie though is not

only in its visual effects but, above all, in the archetypes that Lang uses to weave his story. We have here both the ancient myths (e.g. Pygmalion – an artist whose sculpture comes to life reflected in the character of inventor Rotwang) and the Bible (as seen

with the Tower of Babel). Not to mention that the sole female character of the movie is ripped into two female archetypes – a virgin and a whore, whose name, Maria, only completes the image.

A vision and a universal message are completed with a sociological perspective that mirrors the early soviet science fiction film Aelita. But instead of revolution, he advocated a peaceful end to the class struggle. The main message of the movie seems to be "There can be no understanding between the hand and the brain un-

less the heart acts as mediator." - a message, which Lang has criticized and which has inclined him to abandon his movie. An unfortunate comment as the movie with its moral does not smack at all of the naivety that Lang feared. The film does well defending itself with the fact that its

events and dialogue deliver an important

A big movie like Metropolis requires a big soundtrack. The music was written and performed by Cleaning Women, Nasra, Gudmund Østgård and Ivan Afanasyev. The end product was a masterpiece that complemented the movie one hundred percent and at the same time gave it a modern twist. The thing that I appreciate the most is that the artists didn't go for the obvious and end up with an all-electro soundtrack. Instead, there was electro rock and hints of

> modern jazz. Especially exciting was the use of various percussion instruments, which were used great proficiency to echo the sounds of the machines of Metropolis.

Above all, the music for Metropolis was almost perfectly tailored for the movie - it was delicate during calm scenes, lively in scenes of

dancing and celebration and ecstatic during the climactic scene of destruction. All in all, Metropolis at Verdensteatret's Stummfilmdager was an unforgettable experience and the only thing left is to hope for more such artistic experiences in Tromsø.

traction; light entertainment that can be done extempore and without the pomp and circumstance that other "higher" forms of entertainment, like theatre, exude. But once in a while, there comes a film that breaks that mould. Metropolis is not that film. It pre-dates the mould. It is the genesis from which The Big Bang of cinema comes rushing out as diluted forms in the wake of this greatest of great Epics. You don't watch Metropolis. You bear witness to the two-and-a-half hour birth of cinematic ylem from the womb of the Industrial Age. It is the ultimate proof that Fritz Lang is no mere mortal. He is a Cinema God whose Delphic predictions of

Then we go to the movies, a future mega-city where the class divide original, intended entirety. sees the ditch diggers as indentured slaves can be superimposed with eerie accuracy onto many of our modern cosmopolitan cities of today.

> However, we do not know the full extent of Lang's magnificence. It is a sad truth that the generation of silent films has as a whole succumbed to the brutal entropy of iniquitous time and despite some stellar restoration endeavours, some things are just lost forever. In the case of Metropolis, there are a number of scenes that have been filled with a placate explaining what would have taken place. Fortunately, these are relatively minor scenes, but it is disheartening nonetheless to know that you will never be able to see the film in its

What does remain of the film though is still awe-inspiring and immense in scope. But at its heart, it is a simple love story. It is the love between a man and a woman; the love and respect of your fellow man no matter his station, and all wrapped-up in heavy religious allegory.

The film is set in a megalopolis built on the catacombs and ruins of a previous, long-forgotten city, which Lang uses to draw comparisons with the Tower of Babel. The society is starkly divided into two classes: the working class, comprised of the chthonic citizens of Metropolis who live in constant penury; and the city planners, who enjoy the fruits of their labour. The protagonist is Freder, son of the Master

of Metropolis, who upon briefly seeing a woman from the working class is gripped by a coup de foudre and descends into the bowels of the city to look for her. However, what he finds is the great social injustice wrought upon the working class and he vows to write the wrong.

The message of the film is: "The heart must be mediator between the head and the hands." Nothing exemplifies that more than the music. Composed with incredible vision and imagination that surpasses the original score; played from the heart and with deft hands that strike the appropriate science fiction tone: Metropolis can only be watched with this soundtrack. Anything less would do a disservice to both film and its creator. -- CAMERON THOMPSON

An Andalusian Dog: An Experiment

or the closing film of Stumfilmdager 2011, my hat goes off to TIFF for trying a festival first: one film, played three times seriatim, each with a different soundtrack. Not only has this never been attempted before by TIFF, but they also threw in all their chips by going with Salvadore Dali and Luis Buñuel's 17-minute short titled, Un Chien Andalou (1929). A movie better known in infamy as the notorious 17-minutes of film ever made.

The question is, did they come up snake eyes? No, more like a full house with the jokers way wild. Due to the extreme surrealism of the film and the near complete lack of dialogue placates meant that the bulk of our impressions and understanding came from the atmosphere, which ironically relied heavily on sound.

Some say that the film should be viewed as a look into the sub-conscious; into one's dreams. In its first manifestation with Ben Model playing his own arrangement on

piano and organ, I would even go so far as viewing the film as specifically the wet dreams of David Lynch. None of the scenes made sense and the music only heightened this confusion. In fact, the typical roaring 1920s piano music added, if anything, a tinge of bon esprit.

However, in its first reincarnation, Love Cult lay on a

soundtrack that completely transformed the film into something approximating ethereal. Although still as undecipherable as before, the idea that they involve dreams is much more apparent and with the sense that they were being directed by Tarsem Singh.

The final soundtrack is performed by Mara and Gaute and is the only score that seems to create meaning out of the madness. They employ dark tones with jeering sound effects to completely re-invent the film as a horror. But mo-

reover, unrelated scenes, like when "the Man" is dragging the Ten Commandments and priests as if they were Sisyphus' boulder, could be interpreted to mean that the whole film takes place in a nightmarish Purgatory.

While I enjoyed this experience, I am not surel would want it on DVD to replay over and over. However, I do hope they continue with this experiment next year with a new movie.

All in all, it was a great way to end a festival for silent films... with an emphasis on sound.




The Kid Brother

The Kid Brother møter vi Harold Hickery (Harold Lloyd), sønn av en høy aktet sheriff i en liten landsby kalt Hickoryville. En av de tre reisende med medisinteateret er den vakre Mary, noe vår helt Harold selvfølgelig legger merke til.

Filmen er laget i 1927 av hele 4 regissøren, men i hovedsak av Lewis Milestone og Ted Wilde som var en av Harold Lloyds mest trofaste skribenter. Harold Lloyd står selv for produksjon av filmen og skal visstnok ha vært ganske hjelpsom med regissering. Lloyd har gjerne i ettertiden blitt satt i skyggene av Charlie Chaplin og Buster Keaton, men blir av mange sett på som en likemann. Han er kjent for sitt livlige kroppsspråk, men også som en betydningsfull person i den tidlige Hollywood-industrien. Han var medvirkende i over 200 filmer, før han pensjonerte seg og senere døde av prostatakreft.

Nå er det 84 år siden filmen kom ut i USA, og den er endelig på plass på Verdensteateret i Tromsø. Filmen er som den var, bare restaurert og med ny musikk. Musikken blir her som på gammelt vis, spilt live. Ben Model står får musikken. Model spiller til vanlig musikk ved MoMA, Museum of Moden Art, og serverer oss et relativt autentisk musikkbilde som det vi forventer av gamle stumfilmer. Selv om musikken er spilt med elektroniske instrumenter, er det fortsatt ganske lett å komme seg inn i den ekte følelsen fra 1920.





Art Exhibit Review: Patrick Huse Northern Imaginary 3rd Part

atrick Huse is a tall gentle man

with a vast expanse of snowy white hair and something dignified and timeless about him; the man is a mountain. He stated that he hopes his current exhibit at the Tromsø Kunstforening will be a "polite" exhibit. By this he means that he is not the sort of artist who wants to get in your face and shout "Look at me! I'm outrageous!" Instead, he believes that artists have a great social responsibility. They display their works

in public spaces, they often use public resources and the artist therefore has an obligation to return to the public something of public value. Mr. Huse has looked long and carefully at the world--particularly the north--and he brings his observations back to the public in the form of beautiful, serene, peaceful, yet powerful and profound works of art.

Northern Imaginary is the name both of this particular exhibit and the trilogy of collections. The first two projects were called Encounter and Intimate Absence. Mr. Huse, a native Norwegian, has traveled extensively in the north throughout Scandinavia, Greenland, and Canada for over a quarter century and he presents his artistic documentation of his explorations in the form of paintings, photographs, words, and objets d'art. The portrayal of the landscapes are often Spartan and minimal, mirroring the environment. There is often something missing that needs to be filled in by the imagination of the observer. For instance in a piece called Tool / Terrain one sees the pressed impression on paper of a bird trap juxtaposed with a landscape

in which such a tool would be employed. The actual tool, the hunter and the birds, however are absent, leaving the observer to fill them in with his or her imagination. Other examples are photographs of factories devoid of workers or products and caribou grazing grounds without the caribou. Sometimes a carefully chosen word is enough to evoke the imaginary.

There is a great amount of thought that has gone into these works, and time spent with them abundantly rewards the careful observer.

Aurora Borealis Hunters

romsø is called 'the Gatheway to the Artic' because it is a favorite tourist destination to enjoy natural phenomenon, natural beauty and unique Arctic ecosystem.

The city is also known for the aurora borealis, one of the most stunning phenomena in the world. We are fortunate to actually reside in this city and have chance to see this phenomenon. The students who arrived in Tromsø recently have possibly never seen the aurora. In September the aurora came to manifest the spirit of beauty for anyone who watched.

The name 'Aurora borealis' refers to the Roman goddess of dawn 'Aurora' and the god of the northern rulers 'borealis'. The aurora borealis phenomenon occurs around both The North Pole and The South Pole, in the areas of the Earth's magnetic fields. The aurora is the emission of light in the lining when charged particles emitted by the sun enter the Earth's atmosphere. Particle attracted by the Earth's magnetic field collide with atomic oxygen and nitrogen in the atmosphere, which emits color combinations of green, yellow and blue even red if we go further north.

Many myths and superstitions have developed about the aurora. The Vikings believed that it was a beautiful girl called Valkyrie. A Japanese superstition says that honeymooning under the aurora will produce beautiful children that will be blessed

"The children are told that if they wave to the northern light with something white it will come down and take them away. This makes many children respect the Aurora", says Camilla, a native of Tromsø. Amazed we will stare at this phenomenon; seeing the aurora is a rare and fortunate happening, not everyone who intends to find it,

AURORA FORECAST?

Not knowing when the phenomenon appears, have deprived a lot of people from actually experiencing this natural beauty. It's is no problem finding out if the tomorrow will bring you rain, sun or wind, but northern lights is a bit more difficult. But Utropia have dug through the internet and found a couple of sites that help you to some extend possibility to get out of your house in time to see it.

On Spaceweather.com you can navi-

gate yourself through the forecast of solar storms, asteroids and northern lights. At first sight the page can seem a little confusing for those who are not familiar with terms and number system that is used.

Another site is Gi.alaska.edu that will provide you a map over the region you are inn, and you can see a banner like green stripe over where the northern light will be visible. Softservernews.com/aurora.htm you can get daily updated forecast and, where it will simply tell you approximately how long and whether or not it's "quiet" or "load". But anyway, you might get little result before October, but when it comes, it not too noisy[SMS1]. will be spectacular, as always.

TAKING PHOTOS OF NORTHERN **LIGHTS**

PLACE: The perfect place to both observe and take pictures of Aurora Borealis is dark, preferably on the outskirts of Tromsø, at a place with broad horizon – the top of a mountain or a hill, frozen lake, or a beach. In practice this means: the hill at Ørndalen, Kvaløya's beaches, Prestvannet, or from the Cable Car (perfect except for the fact that it doesn't run during the winter).

TIME: Statistically speaking the best time to see Aurora Borealis is from October to March. The truth is that you may see it in September and even in April, all you need is a clear sky. They come as they please and often it is a matter of luck. Just follow the weather forecast and keep your fingers

EQUIPMENT: For photography, a tripod is a must-have. Exposure time depends on the intensity of the Aurora Borealis, but it's usually half a minute or more. Remember to put the ISO to minimum, so the picture is

CLOTHES: Remember to dress appropriately! Don't just run out in slippers and a sweater.

TIPS: A good idea is also to establish an Aurora Borealis watch with your fiends you have greater chances of spotting them if there are two or more people involved. It's always better to get an SMS saying "Northern Lights!" when you aren't ready to take pictures than to learn about the phenomenon from Facebook updates the next day.


